

SEPTEMBER DEMONSTRATION

Our September demonstration was on buffing and the use of linseed oil for a finish by Ed Cole. Ed does a lot of turning using resin and he went through all the different steps he takes to give his pieces a nice shine. Ed likes using a linseed oil finish on his projects and he also uses the Beall Buffing System using the three different waxes. He explained why and how to apply the three different waxes that come with the Beall system. Give buffing and linseed oil a try on your next turning, it may turn out to be your new choice of finish.
