JANUARY DEMONSTRATION

Our January demonstration was a cedar wall hanging and a cedar natural edge bowl by Kelly Bresnahan.

Cedar is a beautiful wood with amazing color and it brings its distinctive scent that smells like freshly cut wood with a menthol, minty scent mixed in. A mask, face shield and air filtration is recommended when turning cedar because breathing in the dust can be an irritant to the eyes, nose and lungs. Also large amounts of Western Red Cedar dust has also been known to cause asthma

Kelly went through all the steps in making the cedar wall hanging which is a shallow bowl. He cuts the blank 3 to 4 inches thick so you can put on a face plate with 1 1/2 inch screws and have more room for your design. Always check the space between the tool rest and the blank because you will have high and low spots on the blank and you don't want the blank hitting the tool rest. Start the lathe at a slower speed and take light cuts until you get the blank more in the round and then you can take heavier cuts.

After Kelly finished the wall hanging he made a cedar natural edge bowl. On these bowls you are cutting side grain but due to the two branches on the blank he was using, he was cutting both side and end grain. Kelly said he could feel the different grain as he was making his cuts. You can see Kelly's demonstration on our YouTube channel—Baylake Woodturners.
