DECEMBER DEMONSTRATION

In our December demonstration we used Yorkshire and Hampshire paste as a finish this was demonstated by Andrew Schweiteler. This is a different type of finish, using a paste formula from what most of us use. He showed how to apply the paste and how he buffs the wood to put on a smooth finish. The bowl was passed around so you could feel how smooth it made the wood. Andrew explained the difference between the micofine paste and the regular paste. He also talked about the pros and cons of the higher cost of the paste over other finishes that are used. You can watch Andrew's demonstration on our YouTube channel at Bay Lake Woodturners.
