The team included Kelly Bresnahan, Ralph Edwards, Mike Groth, and Ric Van Sistine from Baylakes Woodturners. They joined a team lead by Matt Van Sistine and his sister Lisa Van Sistine. The team was in Kenya following up on a woodturning project that began in November of 2017 in Kissi, Kenya. The woodturning project is part of Africa HEART's Next Gen Program. HEART has spent 20 years transforming the lives of hundreds of Kenyan mothers suffering with AIDS. To find out more about HEART please visit africaheart.com and sponsoramom.com. HEART's Next Gen Program is designed to help the children of the AIDS mothers to acquire skills to find work in a country with 70% unemployment.

The team found the Kissi woodturners, that began their training a little over one year ago, where turning amazing products and now selling them locally and internationally through HEART. You'll be happy to know that the pedal powered lathe that was built by our turning club for the 2017 trip is being used everyday and going strong. It's a key to the training process. While in Kissi the team held a graduation ceremony for the woodturners and started a new class of 6 beginners. Kelly says, "a big part of the success of this program is our Kenyan instructor, Joshua." Joshua is doing amazing work with his students. Many stories can be told about the way this program is changing the lives of individuals and families. One young man even attributes his life being saved by the new found love of woodturning.
